C. Eligibility

Athlete Eligibility
<p>All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors). Only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate at MINSK 2019.</p>
<p>Age Requirements Athletes participating at MINSK 2019 must be born between 1 January 1979 and 31 December 2000.</p>
<p>Medical and Anti-Doping Requirements To be eligible to participate at MINSK 2019, all athletes must satisfy the medical requirements according to the EOC Medical and Anti-Doping Guidelines. To be eligible to participate at MINSK 2019, all athletes must comply with doping control process in accordance with the EOC Medical and Anti-Doping Guidelines and the EOC Anti-Doping Rules.</p>



D. Qualification Process

The qualification system allows for the participation of the best athletes through a fair and transparent process within the framework of the Olympic Charter.

E. Confirmation Process for Quota Places

By 15 January 2019, MEGOC on behalf of the EOC and the EUBC will inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places.

By 1 February 2019, the NOCs will then have to confirm if they wish to use these quota places as detailed in **Section G**.

F. Reallocation of Unused NOC Quota Places

If obtained through the qualification process and allocated quota place is declined by the NOC or is not confirmed by the NOC by the deadline, the quota place in that event will be reallocated to the next best athlete, not yet qualified, according to

1. EUBC Championships Sofia 2018 results (boxers who do not appear on the “AIBA World Ranking list as of December 2018”).
2. AIBA World Championships New Delhi 2018 results (European boxers who are not on the “AIBA World Ranking list as of December 2018” and who did not participate in EUBC Championships Sofia 2018).

Any unconfirmed Host NOC places and Universality places will be reallocated following the same procedure. This process will be repeated until all places are allocated always respecting the maximum of one quota per NOC per event.

A qualified athlete can be replaced with a new athlete considering two (2) following situations and according to the specified regulations:

- a) In case of injury, an already qualified athlete (including the Host NOC athletes) can be replaced with the next highest ranked athlete of the same NOC;
- b) In case of positive doping test, an already qualified athlete (including the Host NOC athletes) will be disqualified and can be replaced with the next highest ranked athlete, whose NOC is not yet qualified in that category throughout the qualification process.
